Fundraising: Total raised 10,595.49 \$.

- Used book sales were held opposite Square Queen in June and August. In order to be part of Square Queen activities we held our used book sales in the parking lot of the former fire station. This meant extra work for our volunteers in order to transport the books. Another book sale was held in December in the Salle Amédée Beaudoin. The book sales as well as the ongoing sale in the entrance of the library brought in 5553,88\$.
- Adopt-a-book: more than 2817.10\$ raised from over 70 individual donors. Of this 933,03 \$ was in-kind donations of books. In 2023 we again invited local businesses to donate and 25 businesses participated. That brought in a further 2224.51\$ in cash and 910,78\$ in in-kind donations.
